As historians and investigators we will-

- Understand how Britain has changed over a set period in time.
- Understand the chronological order of events in history.
- Investigate the changes that occurred to everyday lives in the Victorian, Edwardian times and during the two world wars.
- Ask and answer historical and geographical questions.
- Place locations of cities and counties on the British Isles.

As athletes we will-

- Go swimming to work on becoming competent, confident and proficient swimmers.
- We will be working with a sports coach on a wide range of skills, including football and gymnastics.

As ICT technicians we will-

- Design, write and debug programs in order to accomplish specific goals.
- Learn about sequencing and sequence our own programs.

We will continue to learn about using different technologies safely and responsibly. The school continues to use purple mash for a variety of activities and children will be encouraged to use it at home under the understanding that they can be responsible, as agreed in the schools computer agreement that the children have signed.

As home learners we will-

- Be given spellings to learn every week.
- Be given Mathematics and English/Grammar homework every week.
- Be given a Family Tree project to complete as part of a local competition.

As scientists we will-

- Identify common appliances that run on electricity.
- Construct simple series circuits.
- Explore the role of each element within a circuit.
- Recognise why different materials are conductors or insulators and what that means.
- Conduct different investigations to find answers to questions that we have about electricity.

Key Stage 2: Autumn Term One Hundred Years of British History 1850 - 1950

As mathematicians we will-

- Follow the national curriculum.
- Number and Place Value and rounding.
- Addition and Multiplication.
- Subtraction and Division.
- Fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Shape.
- Measurements.

Shape and measurements will be taught as a whole class maths lesson usually on Mondays and Fridays. On Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays there will be split maths classes. Miss Pope will teach Years 3 and 4 and Mrs Tweddle will teach years 5 and 6.

As authors we will-

- Look at writing from and about life in Victorian times and write our own diary entries as a person in that era.
- Study writing from World War One including letters and poetry and create our own writing.
- Look at war time novels and produce work associated to what we have read.
- We will look at Punctuation, sentence structure, text structure and terminology throughout out work.

As artists we will-

- Research and study artwork from 1850 1950 and use artists and artwork created in those eras to create our own pieces in similar styles.
- Explore different materials and techniques that were used during those one hundred years and attempt to use these techniques ourselves.
- Perform and develop our singing.
- Look at rhythm patterns and music around the world.

As citizens we will-

- In RE we will be looking at Christianity around the world and how Jesus' is considered in different cultures.
- In PSHCE we will be finding out about Nutrition and food, our Emotions and our Relationships with others, including Bullying.
