

**Gillamoor CE Primary School Sports funding for 2014 - 2015**

The PE National Curriculum is made up of 6 elements: Dance, Games, Gymnastics, Swimming, Athletics and Outdoor/Adventurous activities. The only activity for which there is a specified target is swimming. 'In particular pupils should be taught to: swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water based situation.'

**Budget allocation is £7,638.**
