As readers we will-

- Read a range of texts, focusing on 'Emma Jane's aeroplane' and 'The Hundred Decker Bus.'
- Visit the library and choose books weekly.
- Have a daily story time and phonics sessions.

As athletes we will-

- Go swimming once a week to work on becoming competent, confident and proficient swimmers.
- Take active part in weekly PE sessions with a focus on gymnastics.
